UK King's Daughters is comprised of two acute-care facilities - 455 licensed beds in Ashland, Ky., and an additional 10 licensed beds at King's Daughters Ohio, located in Portsmouth. The system includes: a long-term care facility; eight urgent care centers; and 30 primary care and 36 specialty physician practices. We serve a market area of 400,000 people across 12 counties in eastern Kentucky, southern Ohio, and western West Virginia.

For over 125 years, it has been our privilege to serve the healthcare needs of our communities. Over the decades, we have built a strong, vibrant, and engaged medical community. King's Daughters is the region's largest employer, with more than 5,500 team members providing a broad range of primary and specialty care services, including cardiovascular, orthopedics, oncology, digestive health, stroke/neurology, maternity, and Level 3 neonatal intensive care.

In December 2022, we officially became a part of the University of Kentucky, transitioning from a private, non-profit entity into a public one. 






CLINICAL DECISION TREE

JOB OPPORTUNITIES AT UK KING'S DAUGHTERS

Nursing

Registered Nurse (RN) (BSN)

A registered nurse (RN) is a licensed healthcare professional dedicated to providing a wide range of patient care services. They are essential to the healthcare system because they serve as a primary point of contact for patients, combining clinical expertise with compassion and ensuring that individuals receive the care and support they need to improve their health and quality of life.

RNs can be found working in various settings, such as hospitals, clinics, nursing homes, schools, and community health organizations. Their responsibilities vary depending on the setting, but generally include the following:

- Patient Care: Assess and monitor patients' health conditions, administer medications and treatments, and assist with daily activities such as eating or moving as needed
- Coordinate Care: Collaborate with other healthcare professionals to develop and implement care plans, ensuring patients receive appropriate tests, therapies, and follow-up care
- Educate Patients and Families: Teach patients and their families how to manage health conditions, take medications, recover after procedures, and adopt preventative care and healthy lifestyle habits
- Perform Medical Procedures: Start IVs, draw blood, change wound dressings, operate medical equipment, and monitor vital signs. Assist in procedural areas such as cardiac cath lab, surgery and endoscopy
- Respond to Emergencies: Act swiftly in critical situations, such as stabilizing patients after cardiac events or trauma
- Advocate for Patients: Address patients' needs and concerns while providing emotional support and comfort during challenging times

To be an RN (BSN), you must:

- Obtain an associate degree in nursing (ADN), or bachelor of science in nursing (BSN) from an accredited nursing program.
- Pass the NCLEX-RN exam to obtain a nursing license
- Stay current with certifications and advanced training in specialized fields
- American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) certification and Advanced Cardiovascular Life Suport (ACLS) Certification. Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) certification for pediatrics units or practices

LPN (Licensed Practical Nurse)

There are many opportunities for LPNs at UK King's Daughters, whether they are at the main hospital, outpatient clinics, or at Kingsbrook Lifecare Center. LPNs play a vital role as caregivers in our inpatient and outpatient areas, as well as in long-term care. They obtain vital signs, assess patients, provide education to patients and their families, plus so much more.

To be an LPN, you must:

- Have graduated from an accredited LPN training program
- Achieve and maintain an active Kentucky or multistate LPN license
- Achieve and maintain American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) certification
- Meet other requirements as indicated by position



Other Clinical Positions

Patient Care Tech (PCT) and State Registered Nurse Aide (SRNA)

Patient care techs work in the hospital setting; while state registered nurse aides work in long-term care settigns such as Kingsbrook Lifecare Center. These medical professionals work with nurses to provide care to patients. Patient care techs are responsible for obtaining vital signs throughout the day. They also assist in keeping units clean and transferring information into Epic, our electronic medical record.

To be a PCT/SRNA, you must:

- Have a high school diploma/GED
- Complete an approved state registered nursing assistant program (SRNA, STNA, or CNA)
- Have an active SRNA certification in the state of Kentucky.
- Maintain American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) certification
- Obtain and maintain Non-Violent Crisis Intervention (CPI) within 90 days of start

Phlebotomist

Phlebotomists specialize in drawing blood for medical tests, transfusions, donations, or research. They work closely with doctors, nurses, and laboratory techs to ensure the accuracy of blood-related tests and procedures.

Job Duties:

- Assembles equipment, such as tourniquets, needles, sharps containers, blood collection devices, gauze, cotton and alcohol, on tray in accordance with requirements for specified tests or procedures
- Verifies or records identity of patient and converses with patient to ease anxiety
- Correctly labels blood collected from patient listing patient's name, medical record number, physician, date and time collected, and initials
- Correctly verifies in the electronic medical record that the blood was collected

Education/Licensure:

- High school diploma or associate degree (A.A.) or equivalent from two-year college or technical school; or completion of a certified phlebotomy course or one-year related experience and/or training
- National Phlebotomist certification through accredited program

Medical Assistant (MA)

Medical assistants examine patients, check vitals, confirm medications, provide education patients and their families, and assist with clerical responsibilities as needed.

To be an MA, you must:

- Have a high school diploma/GED
- Have a Medical Assistant diploma from an accredited vocational institution or community college, Medical Assistant Certification or one year recent documented experience working in a medical facility as a medical assistant and/or documented evidence of externship completed in a medical office in a similar role
- Maintain American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) certification

Medical Technologist/Medical Lab Scientist

A medical technologist, or medical lab scientist, performs laboratory tests on patient samples to aid in diagnosing and monitoring diseases. Working closely with physicians and medical laboratory technicians, they are highly skilled professionals who monitor disease processes such as anemia, leukemia, metabolic imbalances and infectious diseases. They may specialize in specific areas of laboratory medicine, such as microbiology, hematology, or chemistry.

Job Duties

- Conducts chemical analyses of body fluids and specimens, including blood, urine, and spinal fluid, to determine presence of normal and abnormal components
- Analyzes and verifies test results prior to release of findings for entries into the electronic medical record
- Performs quality control studies according to established protocols, routine preventive maintenance, and equipment checks according to established schedule
- Reports test results to proper provider and documents reporting

Education/Licensure

- Bachelor of science degree in medical laboratory science
- Board-eligible to obtain medical laboratory science American Society for Clinical Pathology (ASCP) certification or equivalent within six months of hire

Medical Laboratory Technician (MLT)

A medical laboratory technician performs laboratory tests to help diagnose, treat, and prevent disease. MLTs perform testing on blood, urine, spinal fluid, and other body fluids and tissue to identify microorganisms, detect cancer, and type blood.

They use their knowledge of pathology, computers, and technology to provide information that helps physicians diagnose, treat, and prevent disease and work side by side with physicians, lab managers, and technologists to analyze samples and evaluate results, which are used in more than 70% of medical decisions.



The field includes areas such as blood banking, clinical chemistry, hematology, immunology, microbiology, cytotechnology, urine analysis, and blood sampling.

Job Duties

- Conducts chemical analyses of body fluids such as blood, urine, spinal fluid, and other specimens to determine presence of normal and abnormal components
- Analyzes and verifies test results prior to release of findings for reporint into an information system
- Performs quality control studies according to established protocols and routine preventative maintenance and equipment checks according to established schedule

Education/Licensure

- Associate degree in laboratory science or medical laboratory technology from an accredited institution, or equivalent laboratory training and experience meeting the requirements defined in CLIA regulation 42CFR493.1489
- American Society for Clinical Pathology (ASCP) MLT certification

Paramedic

Paramedics transport patients to and from their homes and medical facilities, administer advanced medical treatment, and help gather information about the patient's current condition. Additionally, paramedics conduct daily vehicle inspections, ensure each unit is properly stocked with supplies and medication, and drive safely at all times.

To be a paramedic, you must:

- Have a high school diploma/GED
- Complete an approved Emergency Medical Technician - Paramedic (EMT-P) program
- Achieve and maintain active State of Kentucky or national registry EMT-P certification
- Maintain American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) certification
- Maintain Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) certification
- Have a current valid driver's license
- Complete an annual emergency vehicle operators' course
- Undergo a comprehensive background check



EMTs transport patients to and from their homes and medical facilities, administer medical treatment, and help gather information about the patient's current condition. Additionally, EMTs are expected to conduct daily vehicle inspections and drive safely at all times.

To be an EMT, you must:

- Have a high school diploma/GED
- Have completed an approved Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) program
- Achieve and maintain active State of Kentucky or national registry EMT certification
- Maintain American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) certification
- Have a current valid driver's license
- Complete an annual emergency vehicle operators course

EMT-A, additional roles:

- Advanced airway management
- IV therapy fluid administration
- Blood glucose monitoring
- Medication administration
- EKG monitoring



Pharmacy Technician

Pharmacy technicians support pharmacists in providing medications and healthcare products to patients. Working in a variety of settings such as retail pharmacies, hospitals, clinics, and long-term care facilities, pharmacy technicians assist in the preparation, dispensing, and management of medications while ensuring compliance with health and safety regulations.

Job Duties:

- Prepares and distributes unit dose medications, floor stock items, and intravenous admixtures
- Maintains, restocks and trouble shoots automated dispensing equipment
- Manages and prepares controlled substances
- Receives and stores incoming supplies, verifies quantities against invoices, and informs supervisors of stock needs and shortages
- Maintains various records, logs, and reports
- Interacts with patients to provide excellent customer service, which may include referral to a pharmacist

Education/Licensure:

- High school diploma or GED
- Maintains certification as a Certified Pharmacy Technician (CPhT)
- Maintains Kentucky Pharmacy state registration

Radiologic Technologist (X-ray Tech)

A radiologic technologist, often known as an X-ray Tech or Rad Tech, uses imaging equipment to create visual representations of the interior of a body for diagnosis and treatment. These images are vital for doctors and specialists to diagnose injuries, diseases, or other medical conditions.

Job Duties

Radiologic technologists perform a range of duties that involve both technical skills and patient interaction:

- Operate diagnostic imaging equipment like X-ray machines, CT scanners, MRI machines, and mammography units to capture images of the body
- Prepare patients for imaging procedures by explaining the process, positioning them correctly, and ensuring they remain still during the scan
- Ensure that the images produced are clear and accurate for diagnosis, adjusting the equipment as needed
- Follow strict safety protocols to minimize radiation exposure to patients and themselves

Education/Licensure

- Graduate of a Committee on Allied Health Education and Accreditation (CAHEA) accredited radiography program or equivalent
- Associate degree in radiologic technology (most common). This typically takes two years to complete and includes coursework in anatomy, patient care, radiology techniques, and physics, along with hands-on clinical training. Some may pursue a bachelor's degree in radiologic technology for more advanced knowledge and career advancement opportunities
- After completing the degree, most states require radiologic technologists to be licensed. Licensing requirements vary by state but generally involve passing a certification exam, such as the one provided by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT)
- Maintains active Radiographer Operators Certificate (ROC) in the Commonwealth of Kentucky or other applicable states as needed.
- Achieves and maintains American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) certification

Respiratory Therapists (RTs)

Respiratory therapists specialize in evaluating, treating, and caring for patients with respiratory illnesses or conditions. They play a crucial role in managing conditions like asthma, pneumonia, COPD, and sleep apnea. RTs work in hospitals, clinics, rehabilitation centers, and home healthcare settings, often collaborating with doctors, nurses, and other medical professionals.

Job Duties:

- Carry out routine therapy as ordered by the provider including, but not limited to, oxygen administration, aerosol therapy, incentive spirometry, sputum induction, mixed gases, invasive ventilation, non-invasive ventilation, and airway management
- Read prescriptions, measure arterial blood gases, and review patient information to assess patient condition and determine requirements for treatment such as type and duration of therapy, and medication and dosages
- Provide information and education to patient and family regarding therapy being performed
- Determine most suitable method of administering inhalants, precautions to be observed, and modifications that may be needed to be compatible with the provider's orders



 Monitor patient's physiological responses to therapy such as vital signs, arterial blood gases, and blood chemistry changes and notifies provider of any adverse reactions

Education/Licensure:

- To become a respiratory therapist, individuals typically need an associate degree in respiratory therapy from an accredited program
- Many RTs pursue further certification and licensure, which vary by state. National certification, such as the Registered Respiratory Therapist (RRT) credential, is often required for employment and can be obtained after passing exams. Some RTs continue their education to specialize in areas like neonatal or pediatric care
- Holds and maintains a respiratory care practitioner certification for the state where they practice
- Holds and maintains Certified Respiratory Therapist (CRT) certification through the National Board for Respiratory Care (NBRC)
- Achieves and maintains American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) certfication
- Achieves and maintains American Heart Association Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) certfication



Non-Clinical Positions

Environmental Services Specialist

Environmental services specialists ensure a clean, safe, and orderly medical facility and create a safe and welcoming space for patients, staff, and visitors. Perfect for high school graduates and college students seeking a rewarding career with hands-on experience and growth opportunities, this field offers both personal satisfaction and professional development.

Job Duties:

- Clean and disinfect patient rooms, operating rooms, emergency rooms, and common areas to ensure the highest standards of cleanliness
- Use electric floor machines, vacuums, and other tools to keep spaces spotless and polished
- Deep clean patient and operating rooms by performing ceiling-to-floor cleaning, ensuring spaces are ready for patients and medical procedures
- Keep cleaning carts and storage areas stocked, ensuring efficiency throughout the workday

Education:

- Minimum: A high school diploma or GED isn't required. Applicants must complete the Wonderlic Cognitive Ability
 Assessment
- Preferred: No prior experience is necessary; one to three months of related work or training is a plus

Food Service Worker

Food service workers prepare and serve meals to patients, visitors, and team members, ensuring everyone receives nutritious and delicious food. From crafting special dietary meals to keeping kitchen operations spotless, this career is a blend of culinary skills and compassionate care.

Job Duties:

- Create and deliver nutritious meals for patients, customers, and community clients
- Prepare meals like soups, salads, and sandwiches
- Handle dietary needs for special conditions (e.g., soft or liquid diets)
- Clean and sanitize kitchen areas and equipment
- Serve food to customers in our state of the art café
- Learn cashier skills and money management in a fast-paced environment
- Stock and organize food supplies

Education:

- Minimum: A high school diploma or GED not required. Applicants must complete the Wonderlic Cognitive Ability Assessment
- Preferred: No prior experience is necessary; one to three months of related work or training is a plus



Child Development Center Assistant Teacher

Child development center assistant teachers foster a safe, engaging, and nurturing environment for children. Their primary responsibility is to ensure the well-being of every child while supporting the lead teacher in daily classroom activities, outdoor play, and gym time. In the lead teacher's absence, they may step into a leadership role to manage classroom activities effectively.

Job Duties:

- Monitor and ensure the safety and well-being of children at all times
- Collaborate with the lead teacher to create visually engaging seasonal and thematic displays, including bulletin boards and children's artwork
- Assist with daily cleaning and organization of the classroom, including disinfecting toys and surfaces and sweeping/ mopping as necessary
- Maintains classroom compliance with state and local health department regulations

Education

Minimum:

- High school diploma or GED
- Annual certification in CPR and First Aid
- A current state criminal record check on file.

Preferred:

• Previous professional experience in childcare or teaching roles

Security Officer

Security officers ensure the safety and protection of all individuals on premises, including patients, staff, and visitors, while safeguarding property. This role involves patrolling grounds to prevent and respond to incidents such as theft, vandalism, fires, or unauthorized access. Security officers also operate and maintain security systems, enforce regulations, provide assistance to visitors, and support staff in managing challenging situations. The position requires vigilance, professionalism, and the ability to effectively handle emergencies and ensure a secure environment.

Job Duties:

- Monitor buildings and grounds to prevent theft, vandalism, and unauthorized entry
- Assist during incidents like fires, medical emergencies, or confrontations, ensuring safety protocols are followed
- Help control hostile or combative patients or visitors when necessary
- Use and maintain equipment like CCTV cameras, alarms, and access control systems
- Record daily activities, investigate unusual incidents, and keep logs up to date
- Escort visitors, deliver items, and provide assistance to funeral directors and others as needed

Education and Experience:

Minimum:

- High school diploma or GED
- Associate degree in a related field or one year of prior security experience
- Certifications (within 90 days of start):
 - Taser Certification
 - Non-Violent Crisis Intervention (CPI)
- Valid driver's license with a clean record

Preferred:

 Certification as a healthcare security officer by the International Association for Healthcare Safety and Security (IAHSS)

Valet

Valet services offers a dynamic, customer-focused role perfect for individuals looking to build essential workplace skills, enhance their resumes, and make a positive impact. Whether starting a career or exploring part-time opportunities, this position provides a blend of customer service, teamwork, and responsibility.

Job Duties:

- Greet customers with professionalism and courtesy
- Safely operate and park various types of vehicles, including King's Daughters shuttles
- Assist customers with medical devices like wheelchairs, walkers, and oxygen equipment
- Monitor parking and external areas for safety and security
- Safeguard vehicle keys and ensure their proper storage
- Support weather-related initiatives, such as Operation Snowflake
- Collaborate with the Safety/Security Department as needed

Education

Minimum Requirements:

- High school diploma or GED
- Three years of driving experience
- Valid driver's license with no violations
- Successful completion of a King's Daughters-approved driving course

Preferred Qualifications:

• Ability to drive both standard (manual) and automatic vehicles

Clerical

Clerical positions are critical entry-level roles in the healthcare sector. These roles serve as the first point of contact for patients and provide essential administrative support in hospitals and outpatient offices. If you are detail-oriented, organized, and eager to contribute to patient care, this could be your gateway to a rewarding career in healthcare.

Job Duties:

- Greet patients, verify their personal and insurance information, and ensure a welcoming environment
- Enter and update patient records in electronic medical records with accuracy and confidentiality
- Manage appointments, coordinate with medical staff, and ensure smooth patient flow



Education

Minimum Requirements:

- High school diploma or GED
- Must be able to type 35 correct words per minute

Preferred Qualifications:

• One year experience in medical office setting

Monitor Technician

Monitor technicians focus on cardiac care and teamwork within the Telemetry department.

Job Duties

- Observe and interpret heart rhythms to identify irregularities or abnormalities
- Set up telemetry monitors, educate patients, and ensure their comfort
- Record heart rhythm data in electronic medical records (EMR)
- Coordinate with healthcare teams to ensure patients receive prompt care
- Troubleshoot and maintain cardiac monitoring equipment

Education:

Minimum Requirements:

- High school diploma or GED
- American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) Certification
- Successful completion of clinical education/dysrhythmia classroom and on-the-job training program provided upon starting, with exam completed prior to end of 90-day probationary period

Preferred Qualifications:

- Experience in an allied health field (e.g., EMT, medical assistant)
- Prior experience as a monitor technician or similar role

Welcome & Information Centers Clerk

Welcome & Information Centers clerks serve as the first point of contact for patients, families, and visitors at the hospital. This role is essential for ensuring a welcoming and supportive environment by addressing customer inquiries, providing assistance, and maintaining key operational and communication functions.

Job Duties:

- Greet patients, families, and visitors upon arrival, providing information while maintaining strict confidentiality
- Monitor and screen visitors and team members in adherence to facility guidelines
- Manage and operate the main phone system, routing calls and offering information to internal and external stakeholders
- Maintain accurate directories for King's Daughters personnel and departments
- Monitor security, plant operations, nursing, and valet communications as required
- Assist with disaster notifications and issue relevant alerts or pages, including "all clear" notifications when applicable
- Handle incoming and outgoing mail, readdress undeliverable items, and ensure secure handling of suspicious deliveries

Education

Minimum Requirements:

- High school diploma or GED is required
- Must enjoy working with people and exhibit a customer-focused approach

NEW GRADUATE NURSING PROGRAMS

Being a new nurse can be stressful and challenging. UK King's Daughters, offers new grad nursing programs to help you move beyond the student experience and into a fast-paced nursing career with mentored education and clinical competencies to support the transition from new graduate to confident professional. Through a series of classwork and hands-on experiences with patients, new nurses will learn how to collaborate across disciplines, make effective decisions, implement best practices, and prioritize patient safety and care quality. New Grad Nursing Programs at UK King's Daughters will lead you to be the nurse you always dreamed of being.

Nurse Residency Program

We offer the Vizient/AACN Nurse Residency Program™, which helps new nurses build confidence as they transition into practice. It is a 12-month program for new graduate RNs or RNs with less than 12 months experience.

The nurse residency program features:

- Classroom time designed to equip you with the knowledge and skills required to be a confident, competent nurse
- Nurturing support needed to smooth transition into practice
- Bridging gaps in clinical skills
- Opportunities to develop a camaraderie with members of the residency class, providing peer support
- Ability to start with your Kentucky provisional license with NCLEX test dates within 30 days of start

Emergency Nurse Residency Program

Our Emergency Nurse Residency Program follows guidelines set by the Emergency Nurses Association. Specifically designed for the unique decision-making environment of the emergency department, the comprehensive 20-week program fosters collaboration, improves clinical judgment, reduces burnout, and assists with sociocultural acclimation.

The residency program provides both classroom and real-world experience.

Residents will:

- Learn and demonstrate competence in basic, advanced and pediatric advanced life support, earning BLS, ALS and PALS certification
- Receive instruction and gain certification in non-violent crisis intervention
- Receive instruction and gain certification in the NIH Stroke Scale
- Obtain Hazmat Operational Level certification and Emergency Nurses Association Trauma Nurse Core Courses (TNCC)



Critical Care Nursing Fellowship

Our Critical Care Nursing Fellowship provides education, mentorship, and support to nurses making the transition to critical care nursing. It takes a very special kind of person to become a critical care nurse. We can help you achieve your goals.

Throughout the fellowship, your educator will ensure you are matched with an engaged, competent preceptor, prepare your clinical schedule, facilitate classroom training, and conduct focused evaluations of your progress.

Our Critical Care Nursing Fellowship includes:

- Four weeks of classroom time devoted to critical care topics and skills
- Nine weeks of clinical preceptor time within our medical/surgical ICU
- Three weeks of cardiovascular rotation, including one day each shadowing in the CVOR to observe open-heart surgery, the Cath Lab, and Cardiac Surgery Unit, as well as participating in clinical preceptor time within our CVICU
- The possibility of joining the CVICU staff with an additional eight weeks of training specific to CABG and valve surgical recovery

During your Critical Care Nursing Fellowship, you will:

- Receive nearly 400 preceptor-supervised hours in the critical care units
- Benefit from the focused guidance of a dedicated fellowship educator who will help you navigate through your clinical and classroom experiences
- Enhance your basic clinical skills and learn the new critical care clinical skills you need
- Experience medical/surgical ICU and CVICU patient populations
- Receive didactic experience



STUDENT ACTION CENTER

Are you still in school but want to get a head start on your career? UK King's Daughters offers many programs and positions for students in a variety of fields.

Nurse Extern

The nurse extern program allows nursing students to develop skills and feel more confident in the nursing role, preparing them for their future careers. Participants work with experienced RN preceptors and receive training in patient assessment, wound care, medication safety, pre- and post-op care, and various hands-on nursing skills. They are exposed to different areas of nursing so they have a greater familiarity with various nursing units and roles.

Qualifications include:

- Actively enrolled in good standing in an associate or bachelor's degree program of nursing
- Minimum one clinical quarter/semester completed
- Active BLS certification
- Available to work a minimum of three shifts per month

Advanced Nurse Extern

The advanced nurse extern program is a more in-depth version of the nurse extern program and aims to prepare graduating nurses with more skills to use in their career. During this 12-week program, nursing students are exposed to different areas of nursing, including ED, ICU, procedural areas, and case management, to develop a better understanding of nursing career paths. Participants must be able to work full-time hours for at least 10 of the 12 weeks.

Criteria for eligibility includes:


- Must be in senior year of an associate or bachelor's of nursing program
- Must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher with no less than a "B" in any nursing course

Medical Laboratory Science Intern

hands-on support in various laboratory tasks under the supervision of experienced professionals. Interns assist with specimen collection, preparation, and testing, contributing to diagnostic procedures in clinical or research settings. Responsibilities may include operating laboratory equipment, analyzing samples, recording results, and ensuring the accuracy of tests. Interns gain practical experience in laboratory techniques, safety protocols, and quality control processes. The role offers exposure to diverse medical fields, allowing interns to develop essential skills for a career in medical laboratory science.

Qualifications include:

- Actively enrolled in good standing in an associate or bachelor degree program for medical laboratory or medical lab science
- Available to work a minimum of three shifts per month



Pharmacy Intern

Our pharmacy intern opportunity allows the development of essential skills for a career in inpatient or retail family pharmacy. Responsibilities may include pulling and delivering medications and supplies to the appropriate area; medication reconciliation; discharge counseling; compounding non-sterile products; and answering the phone and assisting customers.

Qualifications include:

- Actively enrolled in good standing in an ACPR accredited school of pharmacy
- Active pharmacy intern license in the state of Kentucky

Radiology Technologist Student

Get first-hand knowledge from experienced technologists and gain an understanding of workflow in a medical imaging environment while working as a rad tech student. Under the supervision of licensed radiologic technologists and other healthcare professionals, students learn a variety of routine duties from clerical work to patient care.

Radiology students will build their understanding of anatomy, radiographic techniques, imaging protocols, and patient care while gaining practical experience in a clinical setting. This position provides valuable exposure to the medical field and is an essential step in preparing for a career as a radiologic technologist or radiologist.

Qualifications include:

- Actively enrolled in an accredited radiologic technology educational program. May perform tasks as limited per state licensing guidelines.
- Achieves and maintains American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) certification

Respiratory Therapy Student/Graduate

Take advantage of working in the field while you're in school in the respiratory therapy student/graduate position. Students can gain hands-on experience under the supervision of licensed respiratory therapists. The primary responsibilities include assisting with the assessment and treatment of patients with respiratory issues, such as chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), asthma, or pneumonia.

Students may help with tasks administering breathing treatments, conducting pulmonary function tests, and monitoring patient progress. The position provides exposure to various respiratory care equipment and techniques, helping students develop essential skills for their future careers. Additionally, students will engage in learning about patient care, medical documentation, and team collaboration in a healthcare environment.

This position is typically offered to students enrolled in accredited respiratory therapy programs, allowing them to apply their academic knowledge in real-world situations and gain valuable clinical experience required for certification and licensure.

Qualifications include:

- Enrollment in an accredited respiratory therapy educational program (may perform tasks as limited per state licensing guidelines)
- Must maintain the appropriate licensure through the Kentucky Board of Respiratory Care.
- Achieves and maintains American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) certification



EDUCATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

RN and LPN Educational Allowance Program

UK King's Daughters offers a Nursing Educational Allowance Program for RNs and LPNs.

This covers \$15,000 for the RN program and \$11,000 for the LPN program. To be eligible for this program, the applicant must already be accepted to a program of nursing with a pending program start date and agree to remain in a nursing position with UK King's Daughters up to three years post-graduation.

Successful recipients shall be responsible for payment of any and all applicable taxes and withholdings in accordance with federal, state, and local regulations.

PCT and SRNA Student Programs

Once training is completed, participants work a full-time schedule (12-hour shifts) with limited patient care duties until certified.

Qualifications for this opportunity include the following:

- HS diploma/GED
- Able to commit to one year of employment with UK King's Daughters following course completion

Medical Assistant Trainee Program

UK King's Daughters offers a medical assistant trainee program, a comprehensive program through which participants can obtain their Clinical Medical Assistant certification.

Participants will be trained in all aspects of medical assisting, including, but not limited to:

- Vital signs
- Medical terminology
- Basic human anatomy
- Immunizations and vaccines
- Venipuncture
- EKGs

- Office administration/scheduling
- Other duties facilitated by the clinical and clerical team in the outpatient offices

This program is offered twice a year. Participants will be employed in a full-time hourly position, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, and are eligible for full-time benefits, including health, dental, and vision insurance; paid time off; and retirement. Once participants complete the program and earn their CMA certification, they can apply for a position in one of many King's Daughters outreach clinics.


